Is Your Product or Service Something the Air Force Buys?

Know the Federal Supply Class or Service codes and your North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes for your products or services. Determine how the product or service was purchased in the past and who bought the product.

Register Your Business

- DUNS Number: Obtain a Dun and Bradstreet Unique Number System number (DUNS Number).
- CCR: Register with System for Award Management (SAM)
- Obtain a Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE) Code
- Complete your representations and certifications in SAM
- Complete your small business profile in SAM
- Include your NAICS codes and experience in SAM

Government Contracting Procedures

Be familiar with Federal Acquisition Regulations (FAR) and the supplements.

Investigate Federal Supply Schedule (FSS) Contracts

Contact the General Services Administration (GSA) for information on how to obtain a Federal Supply Schedule (FSS) contract. Many purchases are, in fact, ordered on FSS contracts.

Identify Current Procurement Opportunities

Identify current procurement opportunities in your product or service area by checking the Federal Business Opportunities website or E-Buy (GSA) website which can assist you in identifying 45TH Space Wing requirements.
